Much / Many / A lot of / lots of

much: we use it with **negative** sentences and with **uncountable** nouns. (money, board, water, suger, money, milk chocolate, wood, rice) .

Example:

- 1- I haven't got **much** money.
- 2- There isn't **much** water in the jug.

many: we use it with **negative** sentences and with **countable** nouns. (students, desks, windows, books, pens, doors) .

Example:

- 1- There aren't **many** students in the class.
- 2- There aren't **many** cars in the street.

In the affirmative form:

a lot of, lots of with **countable** and **uncountable** nouns.

Example:

- 1- How many students are there in the classroom?
There are **a lot of / lots of** students.
- 2- There is a lot of water in the floor.



Should and Shouldn't

- We use **should** and **shouldn't** to give an advice or to talk about what we think is right or wrong.
- You **should** mean something like I think it is a good idea for you to do it.
- You **shouldn't** mean something like I think it is a bad idea for you to do it.

Examples

- 1- You look tired. You **should** take rest.
- 2- Alice works very long hours. She **should** talk to her boss.
- 3- I have an English test tomorrow.
- I **shouldn't** worry. I have worked really hard.

To give an **advice** to someone you can also say:

- I am tired .I **should** go to bed.
- I **shouldn't** be so rude.
