1934 - born in Kemerovo in the south of Russia

Alexei Leonov was born in 1934 he joined the RSFSR in 1955 as a pilot in 1934.

1965 - flew in the Voshkhod 2 spacecraft
- 18th March - completed the first space walk. It lasted 12 mins

- 1930 - born in Wapakoneta in the State of Ohio, USA
- 1947 - began his studies to be an aeroplane engineer
- 1949 - learned to fly planes
- 1955 - became a test pilot flew new, fast jet planes
- 1962 - flew a plane to 63 km above the ground
 - joined the US astronaut group
 - began training as an astronaut
- 1966 - completed his first space flight in Gemini 8
 - flew again in Gemini 11
- 1969 - commander of the spacecraft Apollo 11
 - 20th July he landed on the moon
 - the first man to walk on the moon
 - collected rocks, took photos
 - was his last space flight


